## Sample Conversations

This is just a sample of the conversations that CAFNB offers:

**Born to Trouble** - Identifying bullying can be a difficult task. This conversation was developed for young people preparing to work as camp counsellors, but is useful for all youth workers. "Yet man is born to trouble, as the sparks fly upward." Job 5:7 helps us to understand the root of conflict and several other verses guide us in helping to bring peace to struggling relationships.

Pulse of the Culture - Social media, substance, Peer Pressure, and media choices are all topics of discussion when looking at 21st Century teens. This conversation is well suited for church groups looking for new, interactive ways to reach out to youth and understand the challenges that our teens are facing during these days. Proverbs 3:7-8 is our guide as we discover how God wants our students to live.

# WHAT WE DO

The most popular topics in this arena are: peer pressure, media choices, substance abuse, and specific education on cannabis, fentanyl, and alcohol issues. The presentations leave opportunities for students to absorb the information and then ask questions. Middle school students often have questions about substance and elementary students have questions about social media and media choices in general.

Peer Pressure: Young people do not always understand the power of peer pressure in their lives; we start the discussion about how peer pressure works as young as Kindergarten. We have a range of peer pressure programming that runs all the way to grade 12 for public school classrooms. For church groups, we show the Biblical application to handling peer pressure using I Corinthians 10:13 as a basis. "No temptation[a] has overtaken you except what is common to mankind. And God is faithful; he will not let you be tempted[b] beyond what you can bear. But when you are tempted,[c] he

will also provide a way out so that you can endure it." Understanding some of the biblical principles to live for Christ in daily situations is very powerful in the life of a Christian young person who may be struggling.

We provide tools for Public and Christian school teachers, guidance counselors, principals, youth pastors, Sunday School teachers, pastors. Our topics now span: substance awareness /abuse, media choices, character on the internet, body image, dating, sexting, peer pressure, youth depressive disorder, media impacts, positive media application, bullying, and topics that inspire overall spiritual health from a biblical perspective. The Board of Directors for the Christian Action Federation of New Brunswick Inc. continues to be open to the Lord's leading towards topics from a biblical perspective for the purpose of education as we reach out to children, teens and youth!
